## SNOWMOBILE SAFETY

Last meeting there was some debate about kids that have earned their right to drive a snowmobile by completing the snowmobile safety program. The **Fact** is that **Any** certificate holder between the ages of **12 and 16** can lawfully ride a snowmobile **WITHOUT** the supervision of an adult, providing that they have permission from their parent or guardian. So the police can check, but really do not have the authority to stop them from riding alone or on our trails. If the trails are open, and your

child has a valid safety certificate, along with your permission,

They – your child -- are not breaking any laws. Hope that clears up any guessing or questions anybody has.
